e-Minutes Board of Directors: April 30, 2025 to September 4, 2025

May 25, 2025

Julie sent out a draft of the minutes for the BoD meeting held on April 30, 2025. Muncy, John Klanke, Karen, and Scott approved the minutes.

August 8, 2025

Scott sent an email to the Board regarding the CCSC Remington 1100 shotguns. Scott has researched the value of the several firearms owned by the CCSC. He is not confident in the prices or values that he has obtained.

We have 5 1100 'Tournament Skeet' models in 12 gauge. Identification as Tournament Skeet raises the value slightly. Chuck at Heber Gun expressed an opinion that the values would be in the \$800 - \$1,000 range.

We have one 1100 'Tournament Skeet' model in 20 gauge. Since fewer were made, Chuck thought the value would be in the range of \$1,200 to \$1,400.

We have 3 1100 youth guns with synthetic stocks which Chuck estimated might bring \$700 to \$750. Again, fewer were made so the value would be greater.

Since the 1100s have been out of production for quite a while, their value is greater for hunting or for parts.

Scott plans to take to Chuck one of the 3 .22s we have for his evaluation.

Chuck takes guns on consignment for 15% for a sale up to \$1,000, and 10% for a sale over \$1,000.

1. Do we want to sell the guns?
2. Do we want Heber Gun to sell them for us?
3. At what price should we offer them?
4. How will we determine to accept an offer?
5. If we proceed to sell, Scott would like to offer them first to the youth trap team. If so, should we offer them at a discount to the team?

Muncy Zuber, Greg Hill, John Klanke, Karen and Julie responded Yes to all questions.

August 12, 2025

Scott reported on a conversation with Michael Houseal regarding a trap shoot at the club benefiting the Waychoff Senior Center. The club would be paid for birds and the event would raise the club's profile. It was made clear to Michael Houseal that neither the club directors nor the members have the expertise to put together a shoot and that

he would have to find the shoot director. Scott asked whether the Board thought we should consider this project.

John Klanke responded that he was in favor so long as there is a qualified coordinator. If Waychoff will not provide or be responsible to providing that person, then he would oppose this idea.

Muncy agreed with John Klanke's position.

Greg and Lance were in favor of the proposal.

Scott reported on August 14 that the shoot was off. He will explain in full at the next Board meeting.

August 18, 2025

Karen received a phone call from a members wife, about her husband, a 61 year old member, who fell and hit his head at the range on Saturday, August 16th around 11 am. He was transported by ambulance to the hospital and then transferred to a hospital in NLR for further evaluation and testing.

Karen received a text from Regina on August 18th saying that Sherman was home. The diagnosis was dehydration and low blood pressure.

September 4, 2025

Scott received a quote from Cody Turner to repair the leak around the 2 vents in the barn roof. He will put a boot on each vent, attach it and seal around it. Cody quoted \$225.00 for parts and \$200 for labor.

Karen, Lance, John Hale, Muncy, John Klanke and Julie voted to approve the repair as quoted.
